

Joint Seminars

Differences from the General Principles of Decision-making Procedures

The implementation of Joint Seminars has been agreed in the “Memoranda of Understanding” with several partner organizations. Joint Seminars serve to prepare future cooperative projects or to strengthen existing contacts. They generally last from two to four days.

Examples: Taiwan (NSC), Russia (RFBR), China (NSFC), S Korea (KOSEF), Japan (JSPS)

Submission of applications

Submission takes place in parallel to the FWF and the appropriate partner organization. There are programme-specific limits on eligibility and on the maximum amount of funding that may be requested.

Review procedure

Applications are sent to the appropriate Board member for written review. There is no international peer-review.

Funding decision

The responsibility for taking decisions has been delegated from the Board to the Executive Board. A positive decision cannot be taken unless the partner organization also awards funding.
